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CHAPTER 70: GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section

70.99 Penalty

§ 70.99 PENALTY.

(A) Every person convicted of a violation of any provision of this title for which another penalty is not provided shall for a first or second conviction thereof be guilty of a petty offense; and for a third or subsequent conviction within 1 year after the first conviction, the person shall be guilty of a Class C misdemeanor.

(B) The penalty for a petty offense shall be a fine which shall not exceed \$500, as provided by ILCS Ch. 730, Act 5, § 5-9-1.

(C) A Class C misdemeanor shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500, as provided in ILCS Ch. 730, Act 5, § 5-9-1, by imprisonment not to exceed 30 days as provided in ILCS Ch. 730, Act 5, § 5-8-3, or both.

(D) All fines pursuant to this title shall be paid within 21 days from the date of violation.

CHAPTER 71: RULES OF OPERATION

71.01 Operation of recreational vehicles prohibited

§ 71.01 OPERATION OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLES PROHIBITED.

(A) It shall be unlawful for any person to drive or operate any gasoline- or diesel-powered snowmobile, minibike, motorbike, motor scooter, go-kart, all-terrain vehicle, or off-highway motorcycle at any place within the Village of Forsyth, except on property owned by the person operating the vehicle, on property owned by the parent or guardian of the person operating the vehicle, or upon property which the operator of the vehicle has been given permission by the owner to operate the vehicle thereon. Battery-powered vehicles may be operated within the Village of Forsyth on village sidewalks and bike paths, except those within the boundaries of the Village Park, at a safe and reasonable speed, not to exceed 20 mph. Motorized vehicles weighing more than 75 pounds can only be operated by a licensed driver. Medical walk-assist vehicles, authorized emergency vehicles and vehicles operated by village employees in their official capacity will be exempt from this section.

(B) The definition of the terms *ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE*, *OFF-HIGHWAY MOTORCYCLE* and *AUTHORIZED EMERGENCY VEHICLES* shall be as set forth in the Illinois Motor Vehicle Code.

(C) The penalty for violation of this section shall be as set forth in § 70.99.

(D) This section shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

§ 72.01 BLOCKING ALLEY, DRIVEWAY, OR GARAGE.

No person shall stand or park any vehicle in such a manner as to block ingress to or egress from any roadway, alley, private driveway, or garage.

§ 72.02 PROHIBITING PARKING ON CERTAIN STREETS; CONDITIONS.

(A) When 70% of the residents on both sides of the street in any given block within the village limits shall request in writing to the Village Board that all parking be banned in that block, then the Village Board may, by ordinance, ban all parking on the village street in that block.

(B) When all parking in the village block has been barred pursuant to division (A) above, then when official signs prohibiting parking are erected on that block, it shall be unlawful to park any vehicle in the village street in that block.

§ 72.03 PARKING PROHIBITED FOR SEMI-TRACTORS AND SEMI-TRAILERS.

(A) (1) No semi-tractor unit nor any semi-trailer unit nor the combination of the units may be parked on any street within the village for a period of more than 30 minutes unless actually engaged in a delivery in the ordinary course of the business.

(2) Further, even if actually engaged in delivery with the exception of emergency vehicles, no unit or units shall be located on the streets for a period of more than 4 hours, except if the vehicle is parked in an industrial or commercially zoned area but shall in no event be parked on any public roadway.

(B) No engine of any semi-tractor unit nor any refrigerated unit for any semi-trailer unit shall be allowed to remain running for a period of more than 30 minutes after the unit is parked in the village, and no engine in the unit or on a refrigerator unit shall be started after stopping the engine in the village and be allowed to run for more than 30 minutes without moving the unit.

§ 72.04 NIGHT PARKING OF VEHICLES.

No vehicles, including trucks, trailers, mini-motor homes, motor homes, truck campers, van campers, camping trailers, boats, snowmobiles, jet skis, utility trailers used for transporting recreational vehicles, and recreational vehicles, having a width greater than 7 feet, a height greater than 8 feet, a length greater than 20 feet, or a weight greater than 12,000 pounds, may be parked on any street or alley in any residential district of the Village of Forsyth, as established by the Zoning Ordinance, between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.

§ 72.05 TEMPORARY NO PARKING SIGNS.

The Village Administrator is hereby authorized at his or her discretion to designate temporary no parking areas for special events to control the parking of motor vehicles in order to assure public safety. The roadway where temporary no parking signs are located shall be a temporary no parking area.

(A) After temporary no parking signs are posted under the authority of the Administrator, no person shall park any vehicle or trailer in a roadway after the designated time such area becomes a temporary no parking area.

(B) At least 48 hours prior to the onset of the prohibition of parking in such area, standard 11" x 8-1/2", temporary, no parking signs shall be placed at least 1 for every 100 feet in the right-of-way along the area where parking is so prohibited. These signs must be installed at a minimum height of 4 feet above the street. The Administrator, or the designee thereof, who causes the temporary no parking area to be so posted shall certify in writing that such person has inspected those areas where such signs are posted and that such signs were properly posted.

(C) Any motor vehicle or trailer parked in a temporary no parking area prior to the placement of temporary no parking signs which remains parked in the same location more than 48 hours after the placement of such signs may be ordered by any Sheriff's deputy or by the Administrator to be towed by a towing service. If such vehicle is towed, the registered owner of the vehicle or trailer shall be responsible for all towing and impoundment expenses and the registered owner of such vehicle or trailer shall be notified of the tow and procedures for reclamation of the vehicle or trailer by telephone, if practical, and by certified mail.

(D) Any vehicle or trailer parked or subsequently relocated in a temporary no parking area after the time that parking in such area became prohibited by virtue of the placement of temporary no parking signs pursuant to this section may be towed by a towing service upon the order of any Sheriff's deputy or the Administrator. Such towing and impoundment shall be at the vehicle owner's expense.

(E) Every person convicted of violating no parking provisions of this section shall be subject to the penalties provided in § 70.99.

§ 72.06 REQUIREMENT OF SELF-LOCOMOTION.

No trailer, vehicle, or equipment which lacks the ability of self-locomotion shall be parked in any street, alley, or public parking lot within the Village of Forsyth between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.

§ 72.07 TRANSPORTATION MUST BE DESIGNED FOR HIGHWAY USE.

No equipment or machinery which is not designed for transportation of persons or property upon highways shall be parked in any street, alley, or public parking lot within the Village of Forsyth. (Ord. 554, passed 10-1-2001) Penalty, see § 72.99

PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES PARKING**§ 72.20 DEFINITION; PRIVILEGES AND EXEMPTIONS.**

(A) *Definition.* For the purpose of this subchapter, the following definition shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

PERSON WITH DISABILITIES. A natural person who, as determined by a licensed physician, by a physician assistant who has been delegated the authority to make this determination by his or her supervising physician, or by an advanced practice nurse who has a written collaborative agreement with a collaborating physician that authorizes the advanced practice nurse to make this determination:

- (1) Cannot walk without the use of, or assistance from, a brace, cane, crutch, another person, prosthetic device, wheelchair, or other assistive device;
- (2) Is restricted by lung disease to such an extent that his or her forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for 1 second, when measured by spirometry, is less than 1 liter, or the arterial oxygen tension is less than 60 mm/hg on room air at rest;
- (3) Uses portable oxygen;
- (4) Has a cardiac condition to the extent that the person's functional limitations are classified in severity as Class III or Class IV, according to standards set by the American Heart Association;
- (5) Is severely limited in the person's ability to walk due to an arthritic, neurological, or orthopedic condition;
- (6) Cannot walk 200 feet without stopping to rest because of 1 of the above 5 conditions; or
- (7) Is missing a hand or arm or has permanently lost the use of a hand or arm.

(B) *Privileges and exemptions.*

(1) A motor vehicle bearing registration plates issued to a person with disabilities, as defined by division (A) above, pursuant to ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 3-616, or to a disabled veteran pursuant to ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 3-609, or to a handicapped veteran pursuant to ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 3-609.1, or a special decal or device issued pursuant to ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 3-616, or pursuant to § 72.21, or a motor vehicle registered in another jurisdiction, state, district, territory, or foreign county upon which is displayed a registration plate, special decal, or device issued by the other jurisdiction designating the vehicle is operated by or for a person with disabilities shall be exempt from the payment of parking meter fees and exempt from any ordinance imposing time limitations on parking, except limitations of 1/2 hour or less, on any street or highway zone, or any parking lot or parking place which are owned, leased, or owned and leased by the village or a village parking utility, and shall be recognized by state and local authorities as a valid license plate or parking device and shall receive the same parking privileges as residents of this state.

(2) The vehicle shall be subject to the laws which prohibit parking in no stopping and no standing zones in front of or near fire hydrants, driveways, public building entrances and exits, bus stops, and loading areas, and is prohibited from parking where the motor vehicle constitutes a traffic hazard, whereby the vehicle shall be moved at the instruction and request of a law enforcement officer to a location designated by the officer.

(3) (a) Any motor vehicle bearing registration plates or a special decal or device specified in this section or in ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 3-611, or the parking device as specifically authorized in ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-1301.2, as evidence that the vehicle is operated by or for a person with disabilities or disabled veteran or handicapped veteran, may park, in addition to any other lawful place, in any parking place specifically reserved for those vehicles, by the posting of an official sign as provided under ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-301.

(b) Parking privileges granted by this section are strictly limited to the person specifically reserved for the vehicles, by the posting of an official sign as provided under ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-301.

(c) Parking privileges granted by this section are strictly limited to the person to whom the special registration plates, special decal, or device were issued and to qualified operators acting under his or her express direction while the person with disabilities is present.

(d) The parking privileges granted by this section are also extended to motor vehicles of not-for-profit organizations used for the transportation of persons with disabilities when the motor vehicles display the decal or device issued pursuant to ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-1301.2.

(4) No person shall use any area for the parking of any motor vehicle pursuant to ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-1303, or where an official sign controlling that area expressly prohibits parking at any time or during certain hours.

§ 72.21 DECALS FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES PARKING.

The Secretary of State shall provide for, by administrative rules, the design, size, color, and placement of a handicapped motorist decal or device and in the issuance thereof to a person with disabilities or not-for-profit organization which transports persons with disabilities.

§ 72.22 UNAUTHORIZED USE OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES PARKING PLACE PROHIBITED.

(A) It shall be prohibited to park any motor vehicle which is not bearing registration plates or decals issued to a person with disabilities, as defined by § 72.20(A), pursuant to ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 3-616, or § 72.21, or to a disabled veteran pursuant to ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 3-609 or a handicapped veteran pursuant to ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 3-609.1 as evidenced that the vehicle is operated by or for a person with disabilities or disabled veteran or handicapped veteran, in any parking place, including any private or public off-street parking facility, specifically reserved, by the posting of an official sign as designated under ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-301.1, for motor vehicles bearing such registration plates. Any motor vehicle bearing a persons with disabilities license plate or a person with disabilities parking decal or device containing the international symbol of access issued to persons with disabilities by any local authority, state, district, territory or foreign country shall be recognized by state and local authorities as a valid license plate or device and receive the same parking privileges as residents of this state.

(B) Any person or local authority owning or operating any public or private off-street parking facility may, after notifying the Police Department, remove or cause to be removed to the nearest garage or other place of safety any vehicle parked within a stall or space reserved for use by persons with disabilities which does not display persons with disabilities registration plates or a special decal or device as required under this section.

(C) Any person convicted of a violation of this section shall be fined \$250 for each violation in addition to any costs or charges connected with the removal or storage of any vehicle removed as authorized by this section. It shall not be a defense to a charge under this section that the sign posted pursuant to this section or the intended accessible parking place does not comply with the technical requirements of ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-301, regulations of the Illinois Department of Transportation or this section if a reasonable person would be made aware by the sign or notice on or near the parking place that the place is reserved for a person with disabilities.

§ 72.99 PENALTY.

(A) Any person violating any provision of this chapter for which no specific penalty is prescribed shall be subject to § 70.99.

(B) The penalty for violation of §§ 72.01, 72.02, and 72.05 is \$5. The penalty for violation of § 72.03 is \$15. Failure to pay the penalty within 7 days of the issuance of the parking violation notice shall result in an additional penalty of \$5.

CHAPTER 73: MOTOR VEHICLE OFFENSES

§ 73.01 PERMITTING A DRIVER UNDER THE INFLUENCE TO OPERATE A MOTOR VEHICLE.

(A) No person shall knowingly cause, authorize, or permit a motor vehicle owned by, or under the control of, the person to be driven or operated upon a highway by anyone who is under the influence of alcohol, other drugs, or combination thereof. This provision shall not apply to a spouse of the person who owns or has control of or a co-owner of a motor vehicle or to a bailee for hire.

(B) Any person convicted of violating this section shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor. (ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 6-304) (Prior Code, § 70.04) Penalty, see § 70.99

§ 73.02 WEIGHT LIMITATION.

(A) No vehicle or combination of vehicles equipped with pneumatic tires shall be operated, unladen or with load, upon the highways of this village when the gross weight on the road surface through any single axle thereof exceeds 18,000 pounds, except when a different limit is established and posted in accordance with ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 15-316 and except any single axle of a 2-axle motor vehicle weighing 36,000 pounds or less and not a part of a combination of vehicles, shall not exceed 20,000 pounds.

(B) No vehicle or combination of vehicles equipped with other than pneumatic tires shall be operated, unladen or with load, upon the highways of this village when the gross weight on the road surface through any wheel thereof exceeds 800 pounds per inch width of tire tread or when the gross weight on the road surface through any axle thereof exceeds 16,000 pounds. An **AXLE LOAD** shall be defined as the total load transmitted to the road by all wheels whose centers may be included between 2 parallel transverse vertical planes 40 inches apart extending across the full width of the vehicle.

(C) This section shall be effective upon the erection of signs designating the load limits provided by this section at appropriate places on the streets in the village. (Ord. 745, passed 6-16-2008) Penalty, see § 70.99

§ 73.03 STOP INTERSECTIONS.

(A) Except when directed to proceed by a police officer or traffic-control signal, every driver of a vehicle approaching a stop intersection indicated by a stop sign shall stop at a clearly marked stop line, but if none, before entering the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection, or if none, then at the point nearest the intersecting roadway where the driver has a view of approaching traffic on the intersecting roadway before entering the intersection.

(B) After having stopped, the driver shall yield the right-of-way to any vehicle which has entered the intersection from another roadway or which is approaching so closely on the roadway as to constitute immediate hazard during the time when the driver is moving across or within the intersection, but said driver having so yielded may proceed at such time as safe interval occurs.

§ 73.04 EXCESSIVE ENGINE BRAKING NOISE PROHIBITED.

(A) It shall be unlawful for the driver of a commercial vehicle to operate or actuate any engine braking system that emits excessive noise within the corporate limits of the village.

(B) As used in this section, *COMMERCIAL VEHICLE* means any vehicle operated for the transportation of persons or property in the furtherance of any commercial or industrial enterprise, for-hire or not-for-hire, but not including a commuter van, a vehicle used in a ridesharing arrangement when being used for that purpose, or a recreational vehicle not being used commercially.

(C) Division (A) of this section does not apply to the use of an engine braking system that has an adequate sound muffling system in proper working order that prevents excessive noise.

(D) It is a defense to division (A) of this section that the driver used an engine braking system that emits excessive noise in an emergency to avoid a collision with a person or another vehicle on the highway.

(E) A violation of this section is punishable by a fine of \$75.

(F) In accordance with § 12-602.1 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, the Public Works Director shall cause signs to be erected and maintained that prohibit the driver of a commercial vehicle, as defined in § 1-111.8 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 1-111.8), from operating or actuating any engine braking system that emits excessive noise. The sign shall state, "Excessive Engine Braking Noise Prohibited." Such signs shall be located as directed by the Village Administrator and in coordination with such other unit of government having jurisdiction over the roadway, if applicable. SCHEDULE II. SPEED LIMITS.

(A) *Establishment of altered speed zones.*

(1) *Declarations.*

(a) It is hereby declared by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Forsyth, Macon County, Illinois, that the basic statutory vehicular speed limits established by ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-601 of the Illinois Vehicle Code are greater, or less, than that considered reasonable and proper on the street or highway listed in the table in division (A)(2) below for which the village has maintenance responsibility and which is not under the jurisdiction of the Department of Transportation, State of Illinois.

(b) The Board has caused to be made an engineering and traffic investigation upon the streets or highways listed in the table in division (A)(2) below.

(c) By virtue of ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-604 of the above Code and subject to approval by the Department, the Board determines and declares that reasonable and proper absolute maximum speed limits upon those streets and highways described in the table in division (A)(2) below shall be as stated therein.

(d) Signs giving notice thereof shall be erected in conformance with the standards and specifications contained in the Illinois Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways.

(e) This division (A) shall take effect immediately after the erection of signs giving notice of the maximum speed limits.

(1) *Prohibition.* It shall be unlawful for any person or operator to cause, allow, permit, or suffer any vehicle to stand or park on the following streets.

(a) Any person violating any provision of this division (A) for which no specific penalty is prescribed shall be subject to § 70.99.

(b) Any person or operator who shall violate the provisions of the Elwood Street provisions from Ordinance 359 in division (A)(1) above shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not less than \$2 and not more than \$200 for each offense.

(B) *Parking prohibited on private drive.*

(1) The drive between the village water tower located on the west side of U.S. Route 51 and Marion Avenue is declared to be a private drive and not available for use by the general public.

(2) When signs are erected giving notice thereof, no unauthorized person shall trespass on the drive between the village water tower located west of U.S. Route 51 and Marion Avenue, nor shall any person or operator park or stand a motor vehicle on this drive.

(3) The signs to be erected at the appropriate places on the drive shall read: No Trespassing. Unauthorized Vehicles Will Be Towed At Owner's Expense.

(4) This division (B) shall be in full force and effect from and after the posting of sign giving notice of the private drive.

(C) *U.S. 51.*

(1) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to park any motor vehicle within the area indicated below:

(1) It shall be unlawful for any person or operator to cause, allow, permit, or suffer any vehicle to stand or park on the west side of Commerce Place between the intersection with Marion Avenue and Weaver Road, in the Village of Forsyth, Illinois.

(2) It shall be unlawful for any person or operator to cause, allow, permit, or suffer any vehicle to stand or park on the east side of Commerce Place, from the intersection of Marion Avenue and Commerce Place and continuing north along Commerce Place for 75 feet, in the Village of Forsyth, Illinois.

(3) The Village Administrator and Forsyth Village Police are hereby authorized to place No Parking signs along Commerce Place in accordance with this division (D).

(4) Any person found guilty of violating the provisions of this division (D) shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to the penalties as are provided in § 70.99.

(5) This division (D) shall be published in pamphlet form and shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval according to law.
